## NEWSLETTER – SPRING 2025

Dear Alstonvale Resident,

As you may have noticed, the condition of Mayfair Street is deteriorating more rapidly than expected. This is primarily due to the absence of shoulders on both sides of the asphalt surface.

The Town has informed us that repair and patching work will be carried out on Mayfair this summer. As part of this project, they also plan to reinforce the road shoulders using a stabilizing technique. However, one of the challenges in undertaking such work in already developed areas is the presence of private installations—such as sprinkler systems, invisible dog fences, or robotic lawn mower wires—often located within 30 to 50 cm of the road edge.

Please be aware that the Town will not be held responsible for any damage to private equipment located within the municipal right-of-way. We therefore urge all residents to ensure that no such installations are present within 90 cm (3 feet) of the road edge.

The Town of Hudson will pick up branches by the roadside, starting on Monday, May 5<sup>th</sup>. Please make sure that you contact the Town before April 28<sup>th</sup>, to register your address, otherwise your branches will not be picked up.

### **Noise**

Please note that it is a Town By-Law that there should be no noise from various gardening equipment after 4:00 pm on Saturday and all-day Sunday.

### **Dog dirt**

Please make sure to pick up after your dog. It is a gesture of respect for others and for our environment.
